Statement from the Master

The big event in 2008 was World Youth Day. Warrane was privileged to have many pilgrims visit us from around Australia as well as Ireland, Spain, Italy and The Philippines. World Youth Day in Sydney was a joyous experience for everyone as the happiness of the participants was infectious.

Within Warrane we inaugurated a Lifetime Achievement Award, based on a similar award at Shalom College. The first recipient was Mark Butler, one of whose achievements was his work on the winning design for the "Swimming Cube" at the 2008 Olympic Games. Other awards of note were the 2009 Monash Scholarship to Dr Mark Schembri, our first year study tutor, and the University Medal in Electrical Engineering to David Maunder, who has also received four Warrane College Scholar's Medals during his residence in College. The other 32 Scholar's medalists are listed further on. There were also 14 Master's Awards for Academic Achievement presented during the year at Wednesday night formal dinners. Also of note is the achievement of Dr Phillip Elias, our Assistant Dean (Studies), who graduated in December with four Bachelor degrees at the one ceremony: Science, Medicine, Surgery and Arts (Honours).

Secondary Transcripts for Valedicts were also introduced in 2008 in parallel with the UNSW Secondary Transcripts. The Warrane Secondary Transcripts covered verifiable achievements in the academic, cultural social justices and sporting fields.

Workcamps were conducted in Alice Springs over the Easter vacation and in Kenya during November-December. The Kenya'08 Project involved nineteen residents and staff of Warrane. A committee of four students co-ordinated the fundraising and logistics effort for this work project.

As the comprehensive refurbishment project comes to a conclusion, residents and staff are now making use of excellent facilities with improvements seen in both function and style!

Purpose and Goals

Residential colleges form a basic part of many Australian universities. 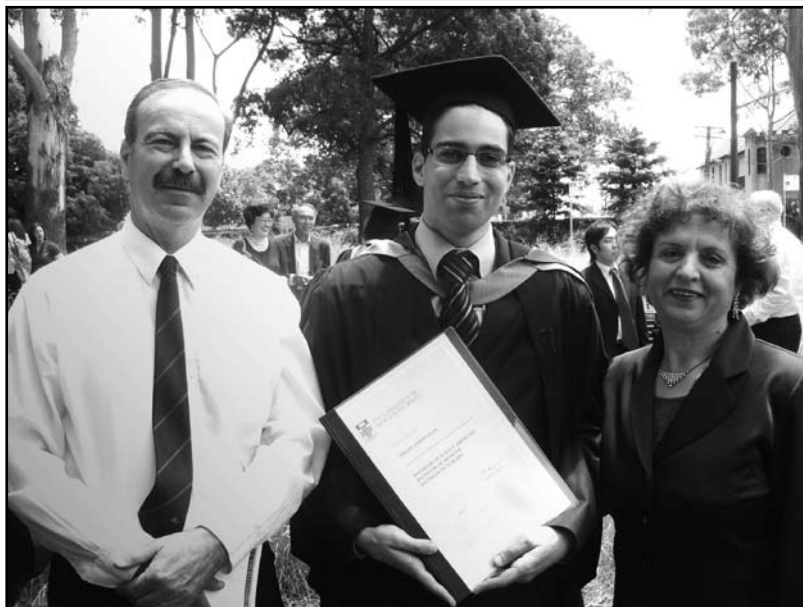

Community Service Projects

From its origins, Warrane College has consistently promoted the ideal of service. This spirit of service starts at home, with the priority of offering a living environment based on friendship and trust. Looking outwards, Warrane also sponsors community service initiatives that attract volunteers from amongst staff and residents.





St Vincent de Paul's Night Patrol

Each month, a team of volunteers from Warrane provides food and company to hundreds of Sydney's homeless people. The evening commences at 6.30 on a Sunday night, when volunteers arrive at St Vincent de Paul's Sydney offices to make sandwiches and prepare the "Vinnies Van". Throughout the night, stops are made at designated areas throughout the city of Sydney, providing opportunities to share stories and mingle amongst people. The evening typically concludes before 12.30am. This year, Roop Sharma was the Warrane Night Patrol Coordinator.

Work Camps

Since 1987, Warrane residents have participated in voluntary workcamps to needy communities in Australia and abroad. Volunteers pay their own way to work for 2-3 weeks within and for a community. It provides a valuable experience to serve others, develop strong friendships and learn about a different culture.

In Australia, workcamps have been conducted in Alice Springs, Balgo and Broome. In the Pacific, destinations have included Fiji Islands, Western Samoa and Vanuatu. Further afield, projects were conducted in Sri Lanka and Vietnam.

In 2008, two workcamps were undertaken in association with Reledav Australia, a NGO accredited with AusAid. In April, 10 residents travelled to the Alice Springs to refurbish a of a community sports centre. In November, 19 residents travelled to Meru, Kenya to build a science laboratory at Ikumbo Secondary School.

Catechism Classes

Several residents collaborate with St Peter's Catholic parish of Surry Hills, to provide catechism (Catholic Scripture) classes at Sydney Boys High School. At this weekly commitment, volunteer teachers follow a teaching program supplied by the Archdiocese of Sydney.

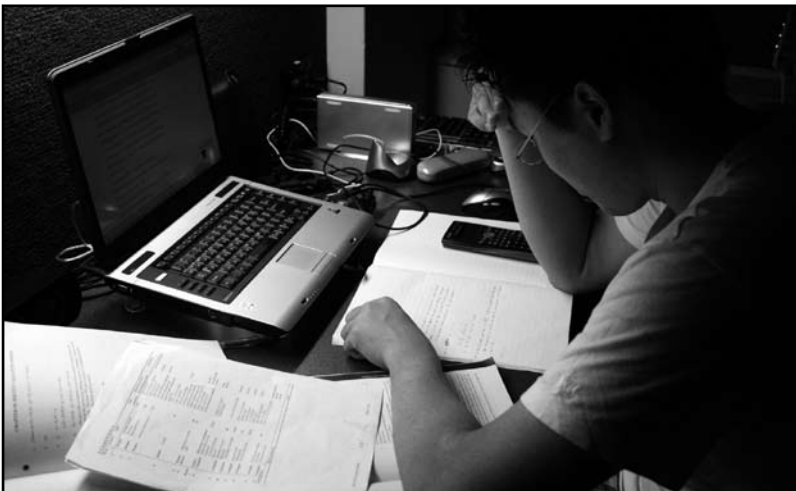
